Mum view: One expat family's experience at a local school in Singapore



Enrolling into local school as a foreigner is not the easiest, but this expat family managed to land a spot for their son. Keep reading for more insights on the local school experience.

During our time in Singapore, we love the multicultural vibes, city life, and being close to our hometown. Then, the great news – our son got into a local school as a foreigner, bringing joy for a few reasons. First, it lets us dive into the Singaporean scene. Plus, this opportunity would set our kids up for a solid future job-wise. Even with the city being pricey, the local school fees didn't break the bank, giving us the luxury of comfortable living. And with saved funds, we could treat our kids and introduce them to new experiences.

As we navigated the system, we stumbled upon both upsides and downsides:

WHAT WE LIKED

1. We appreciated the content of the textbooks and online resources, secretly wishing we had such awesome study materials back in our school days.

 Schools went beyond academics, delving into crucial topics like mental state awareness, environmental efforts, and internet safety.
 The push for kids to be independent

resonated well with us – kids were encouraged to handle everything from packing their school

Homework wasn't just the usual written stuff; there were loads of online assignments, prepping the kids for a digital future.

WHAT WE DIDN'T LIKE

1. School expectations don't always fit every student's personality. Take our child, for instance, not being used to always verbally communicating events and homework.

2. A gap in mindset emerged between teachers and parents. Teachers labelled our son a dreamer. But we saw nothing wrong with that, understanding the importance of dreaming for mental health.

3. The jump from Primary 2 to Primary 3 opened our eyes, especially with challenging vocabulary tests kicking in early on.

PSLE (Primary School Leaving Examinations) felt a bit premature for young minds, heaping unnecessary pressure.

After two years in the local school system, we've come to realise the importance of keeping our options open, especially considering international curriculums if this path doesn't align with our kids. We also acknowledge that the local system might not suit all personality types. While we're unsure how our younger child will fare, we're committed to observing and understanding his experience, recognising it might differ significantly. We're still eager to fully immerse ourselves in the Singaporean ecosystem and are open-minded about exploring other educational options.

The lowdown: International school curricula in Singapore

Confused about which curriculum is best? Here's where to start.

Besides the location and costs of international school, you also have to consider which school curricula will best suit your child. All those tongue-tripping acronyms – it can be confusing! Consider how your child learns best, or whether you plan to move elsewhere abroad further down the line. If you all have key aspirations for a chosen career path or higher education institute, that can all affect your decision, too!

Montessori

The Montessori method is based on independence, hands-on play and learning through experience. Students are allowed freedom to choose activities based on their natural interests, giving them the chance to learn at their own pace.

Reggio Emilia

The Reggio Emilia approach is a philosophy used in the preschool and primary stages. The program is very hands-on and aims to inspire students to use symbolic languages such as painting and sculpture to learn day-to-day. It focuses on values of community, responsibility, and respect by providing an encouraging and inspirational environment.

International Baccalaureate (IB)

The most widely offered curriculum in international schools in Singapore? IB. It receives high recognition among higher education institutions and aims to provide a truly international education by developing academic, personal, emotional, and social skills required for success in today's world.





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International General Certificate of Secondary Education (IGCSE)

IGCSE are internationally adapted certificate courses for students of high-school age. Originally based on the UK GCE O-Level examinations, the content of the course has been adapted to suit the needs of international students who are not studying in the UK, or will be taking a different course in their final years of school. IGCSEs are considered to be excellent preparation for A Levels and IB Diploma Program (IBDP) subject courses.

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Number crunching: What is the cost of international school in Singapore?

Education is one of the top expenses for families. But what does it really entail? From application fees to transport costs, uniforms and pocket money, we break it down below.

Costs at a glance:

1. Tuition fees

The largest expense, tuition fees can cost anywhere from \$17,000 up to \$50,000 per year.

2. Application fees

Application is free at some schools, but a one-off payment can be up to \$5,350! This fee is sometimes partially refundable.

3. Transport costs

Transport costs in Singapore are rising. Consider that the school bus could set you back as little as \$1,100 yearly, or as much as \$8,500. Public transport is a good (and more affordable) alternative.

4. Uniforms

School-branded uniforms are often an essential part of the school kit. Just one set of uniform for one child can cost close to \$300.

5. School canteen



Being more mindful of healthy choices and allergens and providing high quality daily meals, canteen meals can cost between \$900 to \$1,800 per year.

6. Co-curricular Activities

Kids can excel in sports, dance and drama, technology and languages for extra fees. As they get older, there are camps, sometimes overseas! Other costs include books, exams, insurance and learning support.

Things to note about international school fees

- Some fees are one-off, so won't apply from the second year onwards.
- Sibling discounts are sometimes offered to families who have more than one child - check for Open Days!
- Some schools allow payment in instalments, or upfront in advance.
- School fees increase as your child moves up an age group.

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Early intervention centres and schools with learning support in Singapore

Formal education isn't easy for everyone, and some children may benefit with some extra support. Here's how to find a school in Singapore that can help.



The best type of education is one that is inclusive and supportive of our children. Whether your child needs a little help with mainstream curriculum or has special needs, know that you're not alone. Singapore has excellent options when it comes to early intervention centres and international schools that provide learning support programmes.



Early intervention centres

Singapore citizens and Permanent Residents may apply to join the Early Intervention Programme for Infants & Children. This programme caters to children from birth to six years of age. Assessment and recommendation by a doctor is required for application.

For more targeted support, private early intervention centres are your best option. Therapy aside, these centres may also offer life skills training and after-school academic support. We've got a list of the best early intervention centres in Singapore here.

Local and special education (SPED) schools

Local primary and secondary schools that follow the mainstream Singapore curriculum are able to support children with specific special needs. This includes ADHD, dyslexia, hearing loss, mild autism spectrum disorder, physical impairment, and visual impairment. Students have access to Special Education Needs Officers and relevant social agencies.

SPED schools cater to students with moderate to severe special education needs. These schools follow the national curriculum tailored to the SPED Curriculum Framework. International students are welcome to

apply, but priority admission is given to Singapore citizens.





International schools

Almost all international schools in Singapore provide learning support. A select few have learning pathways, in-house experts, and facilities that cater to students with special education needs. Schools that don't may have close working relationships with external agencies that cater to specific special needs.

After-school fun: ECAs, tuition & enrichment classes

The hours between after the school day ends and before going home always leave parents in a bit of a pickle. But with so many after-school options now, there's no shortage of activities and programmes for kids to join. Whether it's extra-curricular activities and clubs in school, enrichment classes, or a particular subject your child is struggling in and needs a little boost in academics, here are the different options to choose from.



Extra-curricular activities (ECAs) in school

International schools often offer a wide variety of extra-curricular activities. Students can join clubs across categories like sports, arts, interest clubs and more. As these ECAs are often conducted in school, you can have peace of mind knowing your child will be safe in school until it's time to head home for the day.



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Enrichment classes

Consider your child's interests – are they into speech and drama? Coding? Art? Sports? Whatever their jam is, there are many enrichment centres out there, often conveniently located in malls all around Singapore or in popular neighbourhoods.



Tuition

If you'd like to help your kiddo improve in certain subjects, it's worth finding a tuition centre where your child can learn English, Math, Science or a second language. This extra support can go a long way in helping them hone their skills, while keeping them occupied after school.





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International schools that offer English language support

Don't worry if your child isn't fluent in English, as many international schools in Singapore have support programmes to help students settle and follow the curriculum. International schools in Singapore celebrate and recognise diversity. Though most use English as the main language of instruction, schools also understand that this may not be every student's first language.

As such, many schools have English language support programmes to help non-native English speakers meet the curriculum's language requirements. Some even go as far as to help students build confidence in the language and settle into school life.





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What to expect from English language support programmes by international schools

English language support programmes may differ in structure and duration according to schools. But they all share a common goal in helping your child achieve the necessary English proficiency level in the shortest time possible.

Usually, schools would group students according to their existing English proficiency level. This allows students to learn alongside peers of similar language abilities, and teachers are able to provide more targeted support.

Students who just started learning English may be placed in specialised classes; whereas those with basic or slightly advanced language skills may follow mainstream classes with support from a dedicated English language teacher.

You can always check in with the teachers on your child's progress!

Rest assured that you will receive regular reports about your child's progress from their teachers. However, don't be shy to approach them to ask for more updates and tips on how you can support your child at home.





The lowdown on homeschooling in Singapore

The thought of homeschooling in Singapore doesn't have to be daunting. With the right support, guidance and advice from like-minded parents and professionals, you can embrace homeschooling in Singapore too.

As the name suggests, homeschooling is the education of children in a home environment by parents, tutors or a mix of both. There are many reasons why parents may choose to homeschool their children. For instance, the child may have special needs, or the parents may want to maintain a religious focus or to be more involved when it comes to the type of education their child is getting.

Homeschooling in Singapore has been legal since 2000. According to Singapore's Ministry of Education, parents wishing to homeschool their child must apply for Compulsory Education exemption. They'll need to provide details of their planned curriculum and subsequent educational outcomes, including instruction in National Education.

Some things to note: At Primary 4, homeschooled kids will need to sit for a benchmarking test that encompasses the entire year's syllabus. A couple of years later, they will also still need to sit the Primary School Leaving Examination (PSLE) in four subjects (English Language, Mother Tongue Language, Mathematics and Science) at standard level. They must also meet the PSLE benchmark pegged at the 33rd percentile of all students in national primary schools in that same year. Finally, they must sit for the National Education Quiz before the PSLE. Foreigners are not legally compelled to send their children to school in Singapore. You may want to check the rules and requirements of the schooling in your home country if you intend to repatriate during your children's schooling. Or, if you plan to integrate them into a Singapore international school at some point, you should definitely check if the school has its own admission requirements.

A bite-sized guide to happy dental visits with kids

Has your little one sprouted tiny teeth yet? Fear not! Here's how to make kiddo's first dental date a happy one!



Dread the dentist? Let's gum that! We've got the lowdown on making kiddos grin – not grimace – in that dental chair.

When should I start on my child's dental dates?

Kiddos should visit the dentist every six months from the age of one or whenever they get their first tooth (whichever comes first). Early check-ups help spot and address issues early on.

How do I choose a good dentist for my child?

Paediatric dentists specialise in kids'dental care. However, your child doesn't have to see a paediatric dentist. You may have a great relationship with your dentist and prefer taking your kids to see them instead. It's your call. Opt for a dentist your child feels comfortable with. Need recommendations? Here's our list of family-friendly dentists in Singapore.

What can I do for my child to maintain healthy teeth?

Regular dentist visits help foster good oral hygiene practices, nip any potential issues in the bud and ensure the kids develop a happy relationship with their dentist.

Avoid foods that cause cavities. Prioritise healthy whole foods. Avoid sugar-dense foods and acidic drinks like soda and juices when possible. Plus, spotting sugary drinks in Singapore is now a cinch! All drinks must sport Nutri-Grade labels. Colours A (green) to D (red) signify sugar and fat levels, with A being the healthiest pick. Encourage kiddos to drink lots of water to stay hydrated. Singapore's water supply contains fluoride (about 0.7mg per litre) and is safe to drink.






