Our guide to international school curricula is here to help!



One of the main things to consider when choosing an international school is the curriculum it offers. The key is to find one that fits your child's needs and preferred learning style. You may also want to factor in the possibility of future relocation plans, if any.

Here's a simplified guide to all the curriculum options offered by international schools in Singapore.



American

Schools that offer the American curriculum are supported by the AERO standards, which is issued by the US State Department's Office of Overseas Schools. Known for its flexibility and academic rigour, this curriculum is inquiry-based and student-centred. At high school level, students can make their own course choices.

British

Students following the national curriculum of UK go through five key stages, with the GCSE happening in the fourth key stage (Years 10-11) and A Levels in the final stage (Years 12-13). Core subjects include English literacy, mathematics and numeracy, science, art, music, drama, physical education, and religious education.

International Baccalaureate

IB is an international curriculum that's considered to be the gold standard by many educational institutions. It aims to develop students academically, emotionally, and socially; and is said to result in better chances of admission into top universities.

IGCSE

Originally based on the UK O-Level examinations, the content of the course has been adapted to suit the needs of international students who are not studying in the UK, or will be taking a different course in their final years of school. IGCSE is considered to be excellent preparation for A-Levels and IBDP subject courses.

What is Discord?

Discord is a voice, video, and text app – think Skype but with a lot more features. You can join large communities or make private servers to hang out with friends. Video calls, screen sharing, and in-built games are some of the popular basic features.

It can also help them with mental health in many ways, like having a safe space to vent or a way to make new friends.


The cons:

International school fees in Singapore: What to expect

Calculators at the ready! Cost is a big player when choosing an international school for your child. It's not just about tuition; there are application and enrolment fees, extracurricular activities... all before snack break!

Application fees

Some schools offer free applications, while others charge a fee — sometimes partially refundable. Luckily, it's a one-time cost and won't hit you again in the second year!

PRO-TIP: Some schools offer discounts or waive application fees on Open Days!







Tuition fees

Tuition is the biggest cost and varies widely between schools. Ask about payment plans: can you pay in instalments or is it all upfront? Remember, tuition fees often rise with each grade level. Plan ahead if you're in it for the long haul.

Transport

Waving goodbye to your child on the school bus is another cost to consider.



Uniforms

This could be a small fee; it could be another hundred dollars or so.

School lunches

The school canteen can nibble away at your wallet each year, so factor that in!

Tech at home

Even if home-based learning is a thing of the past, tech is here to stay. So, budget for laptops and tablets!

A guide to international vs. local schools in Singapore

With tuition fees at international schools increasing every year, sending our young 'uns to local schools suddenly looks more appealing. But can expat kids even get into local schools in Singapore? Lucky for you, we've done quite a bit of groundwork on the topic.

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Do schools in Singapore offer mother tongue or home language programmes?

Yes, they do – and we've got the full lowdown: from the languages offered to the schools that offer them.

Being a country with four official languages, multilingualism is embraced and highly encouraged in Singapore. So while English is the main language of instruction in most schools, many do offer some form of additional language programme so students can pick up a second (or third) language.

What schools in Singapore offer

Local schools

Learning a second language is compulsory in local schools, and this would usually be based on your child's mother tongue. However, most local schools only offer lessons in Chinese, Malay, and Tamil; with a select few offering Hindi.



International schools

Families have more language options in international schools, with some offering close to 20 world languages. These include Japanese, French, Finnish, Danish, and more. Some schools may offer these during normal school hours, or as an after-school programme. You may also want to check with the school if additional fees are required for its mother tongue or home language programme.




There are many excellent language centres in Singapore that offer kids' language programmes. Some of them even offer online courses, so your kids can learn from home too.

HoneyKids mum shares: **"My child needed a non-academic route, so we tried homeschooling"**

One mum shares how she eventually tried the homeschooling route for her teen daughter



My daughter started out in a prominent international school when she was eight years old. After two years, we were getting feedback from her teachers that she couldn't grasp simple concepts and was daydreaming in class. We then decided to transfer her to another school with more learning support. There, the school's occupational therapist picked up that she may have an auditory processing disorder. We got her tested and it was later confirmed that she has Central Auditory Processing Disorder (CAPD).

By this time, she was 11 years old and entering teenhood. On top of a learning disability, she was also developing some social awkwardness and started getting bullied in school. As a result, she wasn't able to manage her emotions very well, began to suffer from major anxiety, and it affected her behaviour at home. We then went through a long round of tests and she was later diagnosed with Autism spectrum disorder (ASD).



Eventually, we considered homeschooling and are so glad we did because we have not looked back. We approached a consultant we found via the Homeschool Singapore platform, who provided us with resources to begin our daughter's homeschooling journey. We got connected to educator Dawn Fung of Little U, and the rest was history.



Now at age 15, she attends a two-hour in person lesson once a week, then heads home to work on her projects on a self-paced learning structure. What I like most about this system is it teaches children to think critically while also providing an accreditation scheme. Sure, she doesn't learn the standard English, Math or Sciences like other kids, but she gets to immerse herself in topics she loves – currently she's exploring the relationship between goth culture and music, and it's fascinating! I'll be honest, her current development and temperament is still unpredictable – she's still battling with self-confidence and anxiety – but I can see her interests leaning towards the arts and I'm glad that she has such a dedicated teacher who always keeps us updated on her progress. While homeschooling isn't for everyone, I'm glad that we had this option for my child who thrives better in a non-academic environment and I'm sure there are some parents out there who may want to explore this too.

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Does your child need extra support in school?

Everything you need to know about early intervention centres and schools with learning support in Singapore.

Mainstream education may not suit every child. Thankfully, there are many schools and educational centres that provide inclusive and supportive learning to children who may benefit with some extra help.

Early intervention centres

If you're looking to start therapy and support for learning challenges for your child before they start school, early intervention centres are your best bet. For Singapore citizens and Permanent Residents, there's the Early Intervention Programme for Infants & Children. There are also many excellent private early intervention centres around that offer targeted support, with some even providing childcare and life skills training.



Local and special education (SPED) schools

Planning to enrol your child into a local school? The good news is that local mainstream schools have a Special Education Needs Officer on-site, and are able to support children with specific special needs, like ADHD, dyslexia, hearing loss, mild autism spectrum disorder, physical impairment and visual impairment.

Families of children with moderate to severe special needs may apply to join a SPED school, where they will follow the Singapore curriculum that's tailored to the SPED curriculum Framework. Do note that while international students may apply, priority is given to Singapore citizens.



International schools

While all international schools do offer some form of learning support, not all have special education pathways. Schools that have such pathways usually have on-site therapists and experts (or have close working relationships with external agencies that provide similar services) and dedicated facilities that cater to children with special learning needs.

TIP: Spray first on your hands and rub the repellent in. Use sparingly on kids' hands as they're more likely to stick their hands in their eyes and mouths.

Mosquito patches for kids

Mosquito patches are super handy – just stick 'em on, and they last long enough without the need to reapply. Plus, several patches don't contain DEET, which makes it safe for bubs. Tiger Balm is known for their effective mosquito patches, or you can check for various citronella-based options on Shopee.

Mosquito repellent lotions

Sprays are effective, but are still something of an environmental menace. Try out mozzie lotions instead to be more eco-friendly. Brands like ING Organic, Mama's Choice, and Bioré all offer hypoallergenic, water resistant, and DEET-free anti-mosquito lotions.

Brace yourself: A guide to visiting the dentist with kids

We fill you in: kiddo's first dental visit doesn't have to be scary! Here are some tips before you head down to tooth town.

When should I start on my child's dental dates?

Every six months from age one or whenever kiddos sprout their first tooth (whichever comes first). Early check-ups help spot and address issues early on.

How do I choose a good dentist for my child?

Paediatric dentists specialise in kids' dental care. However, your child doesn't have to see a paediatric dentist. You may have a great relationship with your dentist and prefer taking your kids to see them instead. It's your call. Opt for a dentist your child feels comfortable with. Here are some family-friendly dentists in Singapore.

What can I do for my child to maintain healthy teeth?

Regular dentist visits help foster good oral hygiene practices, nip any potential issues in the bud and ensure the kids develop a happy relationship with their dentist.

At home, avoid foods that cause cavities. Prioritise healthy whole foods and avoid sugar-dense foods or acidic drinks like soda and juices when possible. Plus, spotting sugary drinks in Singapore is now a cinch! Look out for the Nutri-Grade labels with Colours A (green) to D (red) which signify sugar and fat levels – A being the healthiest pick. Encourage kiddos to drink lots of water to stay hydrated. Singapore's water supply contains fluoride (about 0.7mg per litre) and is safe to drink.

The kiddos' health always comes first but rushing to the A&E for not-so-urgent emergencies might actually be counterproductive – instead, choose one of these 24-hour family clinics or after-hours doctors near you! In the unfortunate situation where you might need to bring the little one for a late-night clinic, remember to bring your baby's passport, birth certificate or ID, and a credit card. These clinics usually have an after-hours charge that may be implemented at midnight, so be prepared to pay around \$80 to \$130 in consultation charges alone on top of the standard charges for any procedures or medications kiddo might require.




